What Kind of Help

- Two Weeks supply of groceries, whatever the size of the family, available every 30 days
- Payments or partial payments are made for the following:
 - threatened cut-off of essential utilities
 - threat of eviction or foreclosure
 - emergency antibiotics or other essential medications
 - some foods and diapers, not stocked at the Community Pantries

Agency History

NSACS has been providing help for the Nitro-St. Albans' communities for over 50 years. Developed as two separate agencies, they united in March 2005 to form one entity. NSACS is a private, non-profit, nondiscriminatory, social service agency affiliated with the United Way of Central WV.



How to Get Help

- Local police will contact a volunteer after hours if immediate help is needed.

Volunteers staff both our local food pantries. Generous food donations from local churches, community groups, individuals, and from United Food Operations provide the food desperately needed to stock the pantries.

Agency Funds



Donations from local churches, groups, individuals and allocations from United Way of Central WV and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) provide our operating cash for assistance with rents, utilities, medicine, purchased food, and overhead expenses.

Local volunteer board members set priorities and limits, review spending, and supervise our social worker / agency director. By cooperating with other social service agencies (public, private and church-oriented) in the Kanawha Valley, Nitro-St. Albans Care and Share insures that funds are distributed fairly among local families with the most urgent needs.
